Within 10 seconds of arriving at a store in response to a call, Sacramento County Deputy Sheriff Julie Robertson was wounded and her partner was shot and killed by a gunman on probation.

From her testimony against AB 392:

“The thought of having to second-guess my actions in that moment is frightening ... Had this bill been in effect, I would have been forced to retreat to avoid being killed or imprisoned. Instead of retreating, I stood my ground and fought to protect the lives of those still in the store ... My only intention is to protect and save lives. How is it that I would be questioned and judged by the ones whom live so distant from the dangers we inherently face each day? ... How am I able to protect and serve the community, knowing that I could be criminalized and demonized for my selfless actions?”
